Job title	<i>Winch Truck Driver – Oilfield</i>
Reports to	<i>Operations Manager</i>

Job purpose

The Winch Truck Driver is responsible for loading a variety of oil field related loads including skidded shacks & tanks, securing, and unloading cargo, planning routes, interacting with dispatchers and logging their activities accurately, legible and timely. The Winch Truck Driver is responsible for safely driving large commercial winch trucks & floats/trailer combinations over long distances including “Off-Road” while adhering to all regulations, bylaws and traffic laws. Truck Drivers will also monitor wear and tear, maintain their rigs and equipment to ensure optimum functionality and safe operation.

Duties and responsibilities

- One of the most essential skills in a truck driver job description, is the ability to plan, to avoid problems.
- Trucker Drivers will take dispatched instructions and review them for accuracy, prior to leaving on a trip. Ensuring, the accuracy of Bill of Ladings, permits (If required.) any other details i.e. directions.
- Plan for rest & fuel stops and brake & load checks.
- Familiarize oneself with the area that will be traveling to avoid construction zones, bottlenecks in traffic and potentially dangerous situations.
- Applying the Standard Collision Prevention Formula
 - Recognize the Hazard
 - Understand the Defense
 - Act in Time
- Navigating safely diverse & extreme road conditions i.e. “Off-Road” to locations.
- Adhering to SOS policies & procedures and all rules & regulations issued by federal and provincial governmental agencies including Log Books.
- Knowledge of loading and unloading procedures, weight restrictions, scaling methods and trailer axle weight adjustments, are essential skills.
- A thorough pre-trip inspection of the truck and trailer is essential for safety and it’s THE LAW.
- Pre-trip and post-trip inspections require the driver to note any problems with the equipment and any problems brought to the company’s attention. A few items to look for are; proper functioning of brakes, lights, appropriate fluid levels and correct tire pressure.
- Log book are maintained accurately, legible and timely ... it’s The Law.
- Submitting Log Books & Trip Envelopes immediately to Dispatcher upon completion of trip.
- Bill of Ladings must accurately reflect load, shipper, destination, and signed, etc.
- Comply with all aspects of Per National Safety Code including Standard 10;
 - Cargos straps, chains, boomers and slings must be checked regularly to ensure they are in proper working order
 - Must be used on the correct type of cargo
 - Not have knots, damaged, or weakened parts that may affect their performance

- Not have cracks or cuts
- Be secured in a way that ensures they will not come unfastened while the vehicle operates on a highway
- Be able to withstand specified amounts of force in the forward, rearward, sideways and downward directions.
- Provide prompt and reliable services while ensuring the safe operations of the truck & trailer combination.
- Safely operating a winch truck to load and unload move a variety of skidded and non-skidded freight including frac tanks; or with the use of a float (flat-bed trailer) to pick up, transport and unload skidded camp shacks, oil field servicing or drilling equipment and supplies.
- Understand & respect the unique needs of each of customer
- Go beyond the expected in meeting those needs, therefore, everything you do, must be of high quality.
- Satisfy our customers' transportation needs. Customers' needs must be serviced promptly as expected.
- Housekeeping ... upkeep the cleanliness of the truck inside & out and trailer.
